- In 2007, my mother was diagnosed with Stage-Three Metastatic Melanoma of the leg
- Following two major surgeries, she developed secondary lymphedema
- Became Witness to Struggle and Burdens Associated with Lymphedema



In the Beginning: Living at Home

- Became Witness to Struggle and Burdens Associated with Lymphedema
 - Lymphedema Requires Mental and Physical Rest
 - The Challenge to Stay Positive


- Desire to Make a Change
 - Passion for Science in the Family
 - Science Fair as a Gateway of Opportunity



- Age 14, began to seriously recall the promise I made to my mother
- Researched and considered a variety of ideas
 - Read an article, which outlined an anti-inflammatory group of compounds that have been recently explored for health benefits
 - Connected with contributor, Dr. Jason McCallum
- Researched compounds further and determined final choices







A Step Toward Change: Proposals

- Created a Proposal Outlining my Project Idea
 - Required alterations due to material requirements
- Began testing anti-inflammatory effects of particular compounds at McMaster University
- Two months later, presented my Phase 1 Study





- Judges, peers, and general public were tremendously receptive
 - Able to reach over 250 people stopped to view my work at the fair and additional viewings had occurred online
 - Awarded Best-in-Fair out of 450 students and the opportunity to represent Canada at the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair in Los Angeles
 - Local media coverage

Big wins at this year's BASEF



- Intel International Science and Engineering Fair 2014, Los Angeles California
 - Representative of Canada
 - Met hundreds of youth and adult researchers
 - Able to spread the word of lymphedema on a global scale
- Upon return, presented at local research institutions along side
 Graduate Students and PhD Candidates
 - Juravinski Cancer Centre Oncology Research Day, BASEF Annual General Meeting, Arcelor Mittal Youth Research Day





- Original research proposal travelled to University of Toronto retired lymphatic researcher
- Proposal was then sent to University of Calgary
- Received an email from Dr. Pierre Yves von der Weid of the University of Calgary regarding my research proposal
 - Laboratory specializes in lymphatic physiology
 - Invited to complete a two-month internship for the summer of 2014
 - Opportunity to focus and expand my current research





- Completed in-depth testing at the University of Calgary over the course of two-months, returning in the winter of 2015.
- Results show promise in the effectiveness of these compounds in treating lymphedema, but there is still a long road of research to follow!
- Formed collaboration with Dr. Richard Austin of McMaster University to bring lymphedema research in Hamilton, ON





A Step Toward Change: Bringing

Light to Lymphedema

- First major presentation at the 2015
 Bay Area Science and Engineering
 Fair consisting of over 530 students
- Thousands of visitors throughout public viewing sessions
 - Doctors, Physicians, Parents, Students, Educators
- Profound interactions with particular physicians and parents
- Awarded Best-In-Fair and opportunity to present research at Intel International Science and Engineering Fair in Pittsburgh, PN



A Step Toward Change: Bringing

Light to Lymphedema

- Presented at International Event consisting of over 1600 youth researchers from 65 countries
 - Awarded Fourth Place Grand Award in Biomedical and Health Sciences
- Presented at the Sanofi BioGenius
 - SW Ontario and National Events in Waterloo and Ottawa
 - Awarded First in SW Ontario and Third Nationally

- Recent partnership developed with Hamilton lymphedema clinic, forming research team with two lymphedema clinicians
- Presentations surrounding lymphedema and lymphatic research at various Hamilton locations over the next months

 - Co-Authored Recent Grant Proposal Aimed at Improving Quality of Life for Lymphedema Patients

 - Provide hope and comfort to those affected by lymphedema
 - Change the face of lymphedema, so that it is recognized on a daily basis
